ROTC SIMULTANEOUS MEMBERSHIP PROGRAM (SMP)

- Serve in the Reserves AND attend ROTC classes simultaneously.
- Commission upon graduation.

• MINUTE MAN SCHOLARSHIP

- 2-4 year scholarship options
 - 100% full tuition & fees OR \$10,000 in room & board
 - \$1,200 yearly book stipend
 - \$420 monthly allowance for personal expenses
- Recipients must serve in the Simultaneous Membership Program (SMP)
 - In which they participate in the Army Reserve and earn E-5/Sergeants pay while serving as an SMP.
- Reserve unit close to school/home.

• NO STATE-OF-RESIDENCE REQUIREMENT

 No time minimum restrictions. Foreign-born service members do not have a time minimum to file. Meanwhile civilian applicants must live in the state where they file for mandated time minimum.

WAIVED APPLICATION FEES

Pay no fees. Civilian applicants pay about \$800 to become a U.S.
 citizen meanwhile foreign-born service members do not need to pay.

- The Army (including National Guard and Reserves)
 comprised about two-thirds (63%) of all military
 naturalizations from 2018 to 2022.
- 50% of applicants are between the ages of 22 30.
- More than 10,600 service members naturalized in 2022.
